ROYAL JOZINI BIG SIX WELCOMES MORE GAME ONTO THE RESERVE

MBABANE - As part of the exciting Transfrontier Park initiative between Swaziland and South Africa, Ezemvelo KZN Wildlife donated a large collection of game to Royal Jozini Big 6.

A wide selection of game including 156 impala, six giraffes, 50 blue wildebeest, 20 zebras and 30 warthogs were released last week to the Royal Jozini Big 6.

The game release is planned over a period of three years, with the first phase of this plan executed last week.

Royal Jozini Sales and Marketing Manager Alistair Brown said the release, which was undertaken by a team of professionals was a great success, adding that the game was reported to have settled in their new surroundings.

"It has been wonderful to see these animals roaming the areas around the development, and watching the Transfrontier Park unfold," said Brown. The development offers a private Big 6 game reserve and resort estate located on the shores of Lake Jozini, nestled beneath the majestic Lubombo Mountains.

The estate will offer privately owned lodges, a hotel and casino complex, 18-hole golf course, waterfront restaurants and a boating marina.

The development is well

underway, with five units close to completion, and 35 per cent of the units on offer having already been sold at this breakthrough estate.
