



For safety and the environment, we would ask you to please adhere to the following rules & regulations: -

#### PRIVATE GAME RESERVE

- No open fires are permitted. Fires at lodge boma areas should only be lit if wind is not too high.
- No hawkers are allowed into the reserve
- No wood harvesting is permitted at Royal Jozini (firewood for braais and bomas is available at the entrance gate)
- **No littering – fines will be issued!**
- **Strictly NO feeding of birds or animals, especially monkeys!**
- No pets (dogs, cats, birds or other) may be brought onto the reserve
- No vehicles are allowed to drive off designated roads
- No swimming is allowed in the dam
- No motorbikes or quad bikes are allowed into the reserve
- No drones are allowed in the reserve without the consent of reserve management
- Walking, trail running & cycling is ONLY allowed in the East Shore Reserve, with caution. DO NOT do these activities outside the East Shore Reserve as there are good numbers of Elephant in the greater reserve area.
- **Although there is a high wire electric fence to keep elephants away from the East Shore Reserve, they do, on occasion, break through this. Please regard ALL areas as having elephant populations and proceed with extreme caution before riding or walking anywhere.**
- All animals are protected, and any poaching will result in immediate removal from the reserve and a criminal charge will be laid under the Game Act.
- No trees or shrubs may be removed
- No camping is allowed
- No day visitors are allowed unless they have booked a day conference at a lodge.
- Parking of vehicles will only be permitted within designated areas – no parking will be permitted on the roads and no parking on vegetation.
- The maximum speed limit inside Royal Jozini Private Game Reserve is 50km/h on the main roads, and 35km/h on all other roads. Speed trapping will be undertaken from time to time.
- Please obtain a copy of the NIGHT DRIVE PROTOCOL and ensure correct permission is received from Reserve Management before conducting a night drive.

#### BOATING AND FISHING RULES

- All boats must be over 3.2m in length
- All boats to be driven by a qualified skipper, with minimum category R certificate
- Boat may only launch at designated slipway(s)
- All boats must be powered by motors suitable for the size of the boat
- NO Jet skis, rowing boats or fishing skis.
- All boats must have the required Safety Equipment on board as required by SAMSA
- No boat may have more than one crew member per meter of boat length. (Refer buoyancy certificate!)
- Boats must keep 100m away from hippos, crocodiles and ANY dangerous game.
- Boats approaching another boat anchored, must keep at 25 meters away and adopt a “no wake” approach.
- 100m from any bank is a no wake zone
- Please respect other anglers’ territory (keep at least 50m from each other)
- No beaching on ANY LAND, except in an emergency
- No littering in or on the dam
- All boats to be back by sunset.
- Boats may cross from eSwatini into South African water
- Skipper must please supply a copy of his skipper’s ticket and boat flotation certificate.
- Fishing is strictly “catch and release”
- There is no charge for launching your boat.
- Please park boat trailer so as not to block slipway. Boats may be left tied securely to the jetty overnight.
